We have now completed our three-week block of RVE, ending with the theme of light in Christianity. We discussed the beauty of sunrise and how light fills the sky, linking this to the idea of Jesus as the “light of the world” for Christians. The children created their own artwork using colour washes, leaving a bold cross silhouette to represent this idea. We also learned about the Parable of the Lost Sheep from the Bible. The children also made “hope clouds,” sharing thoughts and ideas about what makes them feel hopeful, happy, and bright. It has been a thoughtful and creative journey, with lots of meaningful discussions and wonderful work produced along the way.



Starting the half term with the captivating wordless book *The Last Keeper*, Reception and Year 1 immersed themselves in imaginative storytelling. We brought the mysterious robot zoo keeper and each scene to life using powerful adjectives and rich descriptions. The children confidently sequenced events with time connectives such as “first,” “then,” and “finally.” Together, we created a vibrant class narrative, showcasing fantastic creativity and growing confidence in language.

We have been exploring weight by weighing and comparing objects using balance scales.

Reception have taken part in a fun, practical approach to data handling by creating a human pictogram, standing behind their favourite fruit signs. They have also been introduced to tally marks, learning how to record a group of five by “crossing the gate.”

Year 1 have recorded data in tally charts before creating their own pictograms using Jit5 on the iPads. They have also learnt how to save and print their work, and have been interpreting their data by answering questions about the most, least, and totals.
